

Photo Editing Project - Due Friday, March 23

You are to make a project that is filled with images **you have taken** and edited. For instance, this project could take the form of a calendar, children's book, photo journal, or collage. You can also come up with your own proposal. There should be a theme to the finished project. Have fun and be creative!

Project Requirements:

- Contains at least 15 original pictures
- The following editing skills must be included
 - 3 different filters
 - Cropped
 - Layered and adjusted (magic wand)
 - Cloned
 - Combined images
 - Text on image
- The following photography skills must be included
 - 3 different point of view of the same object
 - Rule of thirds
 - Leading lines
 - Panorama Sequence - Panodash or Forced Perspective
- It is possible that some photos may demonstrate more than one skill
- Include an index page that lists each photo and the skills used to create/edit them

Essay:

1. Create a document in your Digital Literacy II Photo Editing folder and call it **Photo Editing Project Essay**
2. Format your document:
 - **Font:** Times New Roman **Size:** 12 **Weight:** normal
 - **Spacing:** 2.0 (double)
 - **Length:** at least 1 full page but most essays run onto a second page.
3. Write an essay with at least 3 paragraphs (*introduction, body, and conclusion*) about your experience with this project. You may want to break the body of the essay up into more than one paragraph - it depends on what makes sense as you are writing.
 - **Include the following information in your essay**
 - Think about the project and using Pixlr
 - Compare when you first started the project to the completion - did your attitude or technical skills change?
 - What parts were difficult and which were relatively easy?
 - Did you enjoy the process of creating this project?
 - Do you think this is a useful project for the class? Why or why not?
 - Suggestions for improving/changing the project
