

Website Project Part I

Objectives:

- To plan and develop a site with a specific purpose
- To demonstrate understanding and mastery of the topics covered in this course

It is time to create a complete website. This will be a website with at least 5 pages and will be a fully functioning informational site. You will plan the content, layout, designs, and then put it all together.

PART 1 - CREATE A PROJECT PROPOSAL

The site must have a specific purpose.

Think about what the site is for, and who will use it. Choose a topic that is relevant to you: a hobby, site for an organization you belong, a business you would like to create - you may have other ideas too. You can make up information for this project. The content and designs will be generated by you - not simply copied from an existing site. Let's start with the initial planning...

ASSIGNMENT:

Pretend you are being hired to develop a website. The customer would like to see a proposal from you before giving you the contract. You will need to be specific about the details. Once you are working on the site you may find that some design and content modifications are needed, and that is to be expected. However, you need to start with some type of guided direction, else your customer will get annoyed and you will have no job. Put the answers to these questions, and a picture of your layout inside of your Google Drive Folder.

1. What will be the title of the website?
2. What will it be about? Be specific.
3. Who will be the visiting and using the site? *(don't say everyone - that is a lame answer - and I don't really think that everyone in the world would have a reason to visit your site - as fabulous as I'm sure it will be)*
4. What are the five main pages that you will have? You can have more but must at least have five.
5. What will be the title for each page?
6. What will be the purpose for each page? Be specific.
7. What colors are you considering using?
8. What type of logo do you think will look best and how do you plan to put this together?
9. What type of images will you use? Where will they come from, how big will they be and how many do you think you will use?
10. What will the navigation menu look like?
11. What will be the general page layout? Keep the logo, menu, and page background the same, but vary the rest of the pages a bit so they are more interesting to look at.
12. It helps to draw a layout of each page
